



# Rhubarb

Known as "the pie plant," rhubarb is a deciduous vegetable prized for its mouth-puckering tartness which adds zest to pies, tarts, cold soups, jams and other desserts. The rhubarb plant gets 3 to 4 feet tall with a 3- to 4-foot spread. It has thick succulent edible red or green leaf stalks. The stalks can grow up to 18 inches long and can get a diameter of 1 to 2 inches. The leaves are poisonous, so do not eat. Hardy to -20°F.

# **EXPOSURE**

Full sun to part shade.

## **PLANTING**

- Space your rhubarb plants 4 feet apart
- The planting hole for your rhubarb should be dug extra large and deep (it is recommended 3 feet by 3 feet). Amend planting with **Lime**,

**Gardner & Bloome Harvest Supreme** and **Dr. Earth Starter Fertilizer** (half Harvest Supreme to half existing soil).

- Water in well with **Bonide Root n Grow**.
- Mulch with 2 to 4 inches of **Harvest Supreme Compost** around rhubarb being careful not to put on top of the crown.

# **FERTILIZING**

In spring after growth starts and again in the summer after harvest. Use **Dr. Earth Fruit Tree Fertilizer** and 1 cup of lime applied in a circle around plant. Every spring, add 2 to 4 inches of Harvest Supreme Compost around the crown of your rhubarb.

#### **PRUNING**

In the late fall remove any foliage, and compost. Divide and reset plants every 4th or 5th year.

## **HARVESTING**

Harvest time is usually mid- to late spring (April to May)

- Do not harvest stalks the first year. Allow the plants to get their roots established.
- Wait for the 2nd or 3rd year.
- Do not harvest more than a third of the stalks/leaves. It needs it leaves to keep plant strong.
- Harvest rhubarb either by cutting the stems at soil level or pulling up at the stems.
